It's simply not right. A new law could mean people are forced to live in care homes even though it's not what they want or need.




This may happen just because it's cheaper and easier for local councils. [1] People living with dementia, learning difficulties or brain injuries could be wrongly **deprived of their liberty** and left with little say over the support that they get. [2]



**Deprived of liberty:** this means taking someone's freedom away. It could mean that someone is always under supervision or control by others, someone is not free to leave, or someone is forced to live in a certain place

But there's time to stop this. The **bill** isn't law yet. It will soon be coming to the House of Commons where MPs will have the final say. [3]



**Bill:** this is a copy of a planned new law to be talked about in parliament.

Disability activists and a group of Lords are speaking out about big problems with the bill.




The Law Society have said that it is "not fit for purpose".[4] But right now MPs aren't hearing from the public.

Reclaiming Our Futures Alliance, a group of organisations that promote Disabled people's equality, have set up a 38 Degrees **petition**.

**Petition:** this is when a lot of people sign something to let decision makers know what they think.

This is to make sure that people getting support have more protections and that this new law does not make them weaker.[5]



Petition

MP's will soon vote on the new law - if we can show them that we expect them to protect our rights, they will have to listen.

"We are not a problem that needs solving, we are people who have rights and those rights are taken away from us" – Self advocate with learning difficulties

We all have a right to choose how we live - living with dementia, learning difficulties or brain injuries doesn't change this.



Right now, if it is decided that someone cannot make decisions about their own care, they have an **independent assessment**. This makes sure their wishes are listened to and the care that is given is what they need.



Independent assessment: this is where someone looks at a person's care and support needs to see what support they need or to see whether anything has changed. It is independent when it is done by someone that is not linked to a person's care or support.

But the new law, in most cases will get rid of people's right to have an independent assessment and therefore their right to have a say in their care.[6]



No matter what, everyone deserves to have their human rights protected and their wishes respected. The only way to make sure that this happens, is to change this new planned law.



At 38 Degrees we all care about equality and our human rights, and with millions of us across the country, together we can make sure the new law protects our rights.
